The field is on the north side of Panton Rd. adjacent to the new solar panel installation (1/2 mile east of intersection with Jersey St. and Panton Rd., <1 mile west on Panton Rd. after crossing Dead Creek). We'll head east to another field on Panton Road after lunch.

Research in northern VT has suggested that variety, as opposed to just day length, is important in determining corn yield. To this end, we have planted an array of corn hybrids to evaluate whether and which short season corn varieties perform as well as longer season varieties. The objective is to test varieties on our soils and find optimum day length so that there is more time in the fall for cover crop seeding and establishment without sacrificing yield. We will also have the opportunity after lunch to look at other cover crop/no-till fields on the farm.
