Purpose

To, as thoroughly as possible, capture the type and scale of the impacts agricultural producers suffered throughout the state as a result of the **2025 drought conditions**. Survey data may be used to inform response efforts, allocate resources, and advocate for future relief and recovery programs. The goal is to understand everyone's need, so relief and recovery efforts are better informed at the community and industry scale. We acknowledge that these metrics do not capture all the forms of loss and damage you are experiencing.

Most questions in this survey are optional. Some identifying questions are required. At the end of the survey, you will be asked to indicate which federal, state, and technical assistance providers you give permission for your individual responses to be shared with. All data shared publicly will be done so in an aggregated and anonymous structure.

Who Should Fill Out This Survey?

This survey is appropriate for all businesses, organizations, or individuals who raise animals, meat, or poultry and/or grow feed and other crops (including produce, maple products, Christmas trees, horticultural plants) in Vermont for anyone beyond their immediate family. Shared production spaces such as community gardens or farm plots must coordinate within their organization to submit one response.

Food businesses and nonprofits who do not participate in production activities, including food hubs, aggregators, gleaners, etc., and individuals who only produce agricultural products for their immediate family should not fill out this survey. Instead, we invite you to submit your drought-related impacts, photos and observations to the Condition Monitoring Observer Reports tool (https://bit.ly/DroughtMonitorCMOR).

This survey should take 10-15 minutes to complete. The survey will close on December 15th, 2025.

Additional Submissions

If you submit the survey and later determine that you suffered additional losses, you can re-submit as many times as necessary. If you re-submit, please only re-submit newly realized or quantified damages.
