

RESTAURANT & TRANSPORTATION GUIDE

OVERVIEW

In downtown Burlington, many restaurants are concentrated along the Church Street Marketplace, a pedestrian mall, or in the blocks adjacent to it. The conference hotel runs a shuttle bus to Church Street. There is a free bus – the #11 College Street Shuttle – that runs between Church Street and the UVM campus. The #1 and #2 buses also run between downtown and the conference hotel; one-way fare is \$1.25. The UVM campus is between the conference hotel and downtown Burlington.

If you leave the conference hotel and go in the other direction, you're in South Burlington. There are a few restaurants within reasonable walking distance; they are also accessible by on the #1 and #2 buses. One-way fare is \$1.25.

On the whole, Vermont favors local businesses over chains, so you won't see very many standards of the American dining landscape. The local restaurants are great though! Many emphasize locally sourced ingredients, helping to define a central element of Vermont culture.

Many of the restaurants listed below have bars, but there are also several other stand-alone bars on or near Church Street. Locally brewed beers are a big deal around here!

Don't forget the ice cream! Vermont is home to Ben & Jerry's, which has a parlor at 36 Church Street. Or head down to Burlington Bay (125 Battery Street) for a more regional specialty: a maple creemee.
