

AGRICULTURAL BUSINESS PROGRAMS

FARM VIABILITY • Betsy Miller

Providing farm owners with business education resources and skills development, as well as one-on-one planning services using the following models:

- **Full Business Plan:** Develop a comprehensive business plan that covers all aspects of the business for 1-3 years.
- **Cash Flow Plan:** Develop budgets and update the financial statements needed to make strategic decisions or apply for financing.
- **Enterprise Analysis Plan:** Single out and analyze one enterprise within your business or test the feasibility of a new idea.
- **Transition Plan:** Develop a plan to phase out of one ag product and begin or expand production of another. Could include enterprise analysis, goal setting, cash flow analysis, etc.
- **Transfer Plan:** Planning focused on the unique relational, tax and legal consideration of transferring ownership and management of the farm to other people or parties.

WATER QUALITY BUSINESS ANALYSIS • Tony Kitsos

Business educators work with farm owners to assess and plan financially for meeting water quality goals. Analysis will include:

- Strategic planning for your farm.
- Integration of conservation and business planning.
- Support for your projects and coordination with related agencies.

NORTHEAST DIRECT VEGETABLE BENCHMARK • Mark Cannella

Business educators work with farms throughout the region to assist with financial analysis and develop regional benchmark metrics. Participation includes a full financial analysis report.

FOREST BUSINESS • Chris Lindgren

Providing businesses in Vermont's forest product sector with management resources, skills development, and one-on-one planning services including:

- Full business plans
- Job-level cost analysis

- Equipment investment analysis
- Marketing

Services are available for loggers, foresters, processors, mills, wood workers, wood manufacturers, timber framers and other wood products businesses.

Maple Business Benchmark & Planning • Mark Cannella

Syrup and sap producers meet with program advisors to compile an annual cost-of-production analysis (available for 15,000 to 30,000-tap enterprises).
