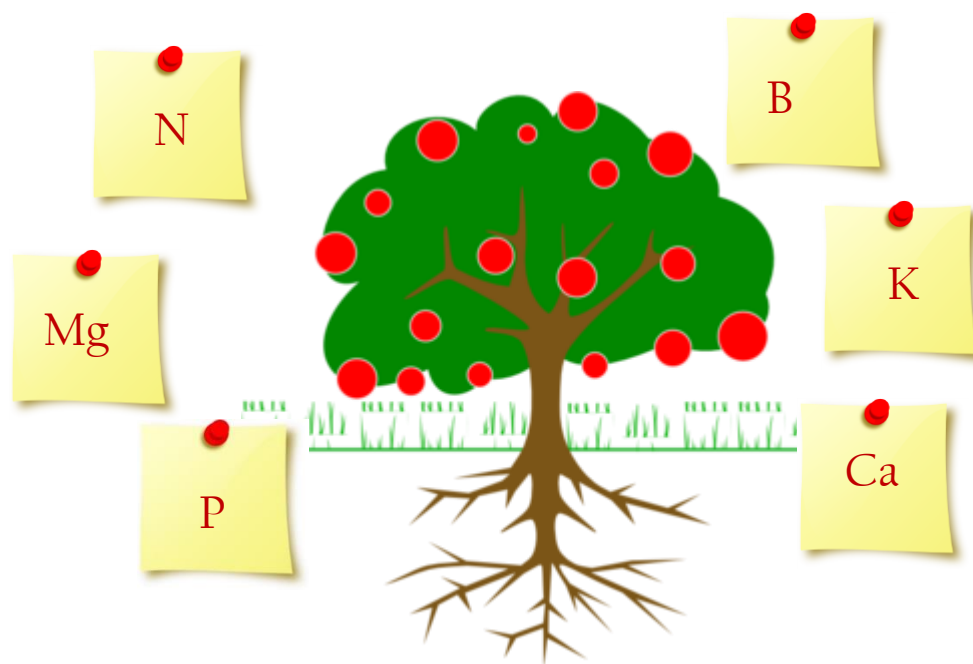

From the south, east and west
Take I-91 or I-84 to I-291.
Take Exit 4 for Rt. 5 (north) – turn left at bottom of ramp.
After 3.5 miles turn right onto Sullivan Ave (Rt. 194).
In ¼ mile take a left onto Rye St., Maneeley's is on the left.

From the North
Take I-91 south to exit 44 – US 5 toward E. Windsor.
