Mike Eastman Dairy

Mike Eastman's farm is a small, fully-organic low-input operation located in the heart of Addison, Vermont. Mike is a St. Albans Coop member and ships to Organic Valley. Mike feeds no grain to his 30 to 40 cows on his 300 arce property; instead Mike relies on summer grazing and stored dried hay for the winter.

When asked why he is working with UVM Extension on a Biosecurity study, Mike responded,

"If an agricultural emergency were to actually happen, the farmer would get hit both economically and emotionally. I want to make sure the farmer is taken care of and see that the solution is better than the illness."


